



List of Composers with Biographical Sketches

Baroque Era

Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). German composer and musician of the late Baroque period, notably one of the greatest composers of all time.

Christian Petzold (1677-1733). A friend of the Bach family, he composed many pieces from the *Anna Magdalena Bach Notebook*. German composer, court organist, and court chamber composer.

Paul Peuerl (c. 1570-1624). Austrian composer and organ builder. Peuerl wrote mainly instrumental music and worked as an organist in Horn and Steyr Austria. The Intrada was used as an entrance song to welcome guests to a party or event.

Johann Hermann Schein (1586-1630). German composer. The allemande was a popular dance form during the Baroque era, along with the courante, the sarabande, and the gigue.

Classical Era

Carl Phillip Emmanuel Bach (1714-1748). German composer and musician. The fifth son of Johann Sebastian Bach and Maria Barbara Bach. He composed both Baroque and Classical period music.

Ludwig van Beethoven (1779-1827). German composer and pianist. One of the greatest composers of all time. His music transitioned from the Classical to the Romantic period.

Romantic Era

Cornelius Gurlitt. (1820 – 1901). German composer and pianist. He belonged to the circle of friends of Schumann and Brahms. His small works for young people were particularly beloved.

Fritz Spindler (1817 –1905). German pianist and composer, especially of works for the piano. He was a very prolific composer. During his life over four hundred compositions were published, most of them were written for piano.

Modern Era

Bela Bartok (1881-1945). Hungarian composer, pianist, and authority on folk music. He is considered to be one of his country's greatest composers along with Franz Liszt.

Federico Ermirio (1950 -). Italian composer. In 2005 he was awarded the Ibla Grand Prize (New York) as “best composer of the year”, introducing “Alata (ash on the shore)” for violin and orchestra.

Nancy Faber (1966 -). American composer and author. Nancy and her husband Randall Faber have combined their backgrounds as composer and performer to become leading supporters of piano teachers and students. The husband and wife team has authored over 300 publications, including the highly respected Piano Adventures® method which has motivated students around the world.

Dianne Goolkasian Rahbee (1938-). American composer, trained at the Juilliard School of Music and Salzburg Mozarteum.
